# **Allergies**

Please can I remind parents that we do have children with serious allergies to nuts in the school and therefore request that you do not send in any items in packed lunches which are overtly nut based. Items containing nut ingredients (eg certain types of chocolate) are OK, but we ask that products that are predominantly nut are not sent in. Thank you for your cooperation. We are also pleased to let you know that we have purchased additional epi pens and inhalers, which are stored in school, and staff received training in dealing with anaphylaxis and asthma.



## Parking, Collection and Drop Off

This is somewhat of a national issue, and every school has issues particularly at 'peak times', but please can we work together and be mindful of our neighbours and each other when parking, dropping off and collecting. We are getting reports from parents as well as Community Patrol that some of the parking and positioning is causing issues, and especially dangerous when blocking off the side access road between school and the public grass, as that would be access for emergency services. Please can we work together on this, and can I encourage you as much as possible to walk to school, or to park a little further up Fairview Road and then walk the remainder of the way.
