## Parent Governor

Earlier this year, we recruited for a vacancy we had on our Governing Body for a Parent Governor. I am delighted to let you know that Miss Beth McDevitt came forward and has joined the team. Beth joins Mrs Dawn Crawford as our Parent Governor representatives and the rest of our Governing Body.

## Curriculum Projects

This year, there are two exciting curriculum projects we would like to share with you. The first is our work with the Laurel Trust, looking at the impact of 'authentic' learning experiences to share and celebrate children's work. Research has shown that providing learners with opportunities to share their work with wider audiences, particularly with 'experts' in the field, has a positive impact on engagement, motivation and retention of learning. This includes opportunities for children to share their work with each other, with parents/carers, and the wider community. Previous work we have done on these lines has seen children write letters to their local MP about the importance of environmental issues. These letters really motivated the children, and even resulted in Mick Whitley MP visiting the school to talk to the children about what he hopes to take back to Parliament about the issues they raised. Over the course of the year, staff will be looking at planning and finding opportunities to create this 'authentic audience' approach so we can't wait to share more with you.

We are also delighted to be working alongside Speech and Language UK on a project on Vocabulary, Communication and Language across the school. Having good levels of language and communication is really important so that we can convey thoughts and feelings. Boosting children's vocabulary across the school is a central piece of work we are undertaking, supported by Speech and Language UK who have visited and delivered staff training on questioning to promote vocabulary development. This is a really fascinating area and staff enjoyed the challenge of reflecting on how questions can be adapted. We are sure this project will have a huge impact and we will be sending home further materials over the next two terms.



A reminder that we close for Christmas on Thursday 21st December and re open on Monday 8th January 2024. To finish the term, next week we have our Carols by Candlelight event on Tuesday 19th at 6.30pm in school. PTA Grotto on Wednesday 20th and then the last day is Thursday 21st.
