Attendance

As you are aware, we are raising the profile of the importance of good attendance at school. This is a Wirral wide project to ensure every child has the best possible start to life by having good school attendance. It is particularly relevant to us, as we have noted a downward trend in our overall attendance, falling below the expected minimum 96%, as well as an increase in the number of children counted as having 'Persistent Absence' - absence below 90%.

You will have seen a Wirral attendance officer, Paul Smith, on site in order to challenge late arrivals, and hold attendance meetings where there is a concern.

We are hoping that this fall in attendance will have been a temporary dip and thank all the parents who have made a real effort to improve attendance and punctuality.

It really is in the best interests of your child to be in school - as the phrase goes, we can't teach an empty chair, and all their friends do miss them when they are not in. This drive will continue next half term and we thank you for your support.


