Catering

In our Autumn 2 Newsletter I mentioned that in the New Year we would be staring with a new catering provider - Innovate, part of IFG. Our new team started in January and you may have heard the children talk about the new chef, Sunni, and his amazing food! Sadly, Sunni, was only here for a period to get the new team started, so he has now moved on, but the great team and delicious food remain! The feedback we have had from the children has



been great and they are really enjoying the new menu, trying out lots of new flavours and ingredients and making the most of the enhanced salad bar. As with any new system, there have been a few teething problems, especially with linking the new menu to the Parent Pay system. This is still a work in progress and we are aware that there is still some functionality not quite right, but this is being worked on with Parent Pay. We are also just waiting for the final menu options so these can be added to our website and posters around school.

One thing we could really do with your support with - please do use Parent Pay to pre order the meals (all



children including KS1, KS2 and FSM). The kitchen need the numbers each day to make sure that they prepare enough food. If parents don't pre order, it means class teachers need to do this as part of morning routines. This then eats into curriculum time - first thing is often when children have their reading, Times Tables, spelling, handwriting etc. If we could get a 100% parent engagement, it would mean this time could be used for the above activities, rather than having to log in for each child and order the food choices. If you have not downloaded or used Parent Pay, please contact the office and Angie and Nat will be happy to help. Many thanks for your support with this.

As mentioned, there have been a few teething issues with moving provider, but the most important thing is that the children are receiving a healthy, nutritious and delicious balanced diet. Feedback has been really positive and we are seeing an increase in meal uptake. Can we also remind you that your child can start school meals whenever they want, or hop on and off each day - as long as you order on the app. We want to be as flexible as possible and make sure that lunch time is a lovely and positive time with good friends, good food and good service. If you have any further feedback about the school meals, please do let us know and we can work with Innovate to make any further enhancements.

Attendance

As you are aware, we continue to have a big focus on improving our figure for overall attendance, and for reducing our amount of Persistent Absence (any pupil with attendance below 90%). We share our attendance figure with you each half term so you can see how we are performing. For the year to date, our overall attendance stands at 94% and our Persist Absence is 17% Unfortunately both of these figures are below our targets. We appreciate and understand that these last few weeks and months have seen lots of illness, with bugs, including Covid, still continuing to circulate. If your child is poorly, then keeping them off might be the correct thing to do. However, if they are "ok', so for example just a bit of a sore throat etc, please do send them in - we can always call if they become ill. Likewise, we see some children kept off with things like 'sore feet.' We are also aware that holiday season is fast approaching. Please understand that we cannot authorise holidays. This is an instruction from the Local Authority. Thank you for your continued support to encourage good attendance, getting the children in good habits for High School and later life.
