
# **Head-lines**

# Parent view - Our Published Curriculum

Last term, we ran an online Parent View survey, using the questions from the Ofsted Parent View website. Many thanks for all your feedback and views. I was really pleased with the results, as on the whole, they were indicating that as parents, you are happy with all of the work of our school -including pupil safety, pupil behaviour, expectations and progress. The full survey results will be sent in a separate letter. One area which was highlighted was in response to the question: 'The School makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year'

This came out as our lowest score, with around 14% of parents responding that information about our curriculum and Programmes of Study for each year group was less clear. This is useful information for us and something we can address with relative ease.
