Mental Health of children

Earlier this year we were delighted to be invited to be involved in the opening of the Children's Mental

Health wing of St Catherine's Hospital. Madison from Year 6 was asked to say a few words about the importance of supporting children's mental health and about her encounter of talking to Harry and Meghan Duke and Duchess of Sussex about her aspirations to become a mental health nurse. This was then followed up as we welcomed some

students from St Anslem's College to deliver an assembly about body image and caring for our minds.

Mental Health in children and young people is a vital area and one which we are hoping to explore and develop next year. In order to support our children mentally as well as academically and physically,

we have a member of staff embarking on training to become an 'ELSA' (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant). This training covers modules such as Building resilience and self-esteem, Managing emotions and Supporting children through trauma such as bereavement or change. We are also in the process of developing and creating a 'nurture' room - a safe and welcoming space children can work with staff on these aspects of care. We are clear that this is an area we want to add to our curriculum to help our children be the best versions of themselves.



Sun Safety

Without wanting to 'jinx' it, hopefully the sun will continue to shine when we return after half term! Please could you consider 'sun safety' when sending children in to school make sure they have a water bottle, and apply suncream before sending them in.
